California State Election Process

Mr. Mark Lunn will explain. Mr. Lunn identified his mission as the County Clerk and Recorder as "Preserving History and Protecting Democracy" for the voters.

Mark Lunn was first elected Ventura County's Clerk and Recorder in 2010 bringing to the office an innovative agenda to preserve the County's historical heritage, protect the public's personal documents, and ensure elections are as fair as they are free. He overwhelmingly won re-election in 2014.

A public servant with four decades of experience at the city, county and state level, Mark is active in the community and has served on numerous non-profit executive boards. He was a Planning Commissioner member and Chairman for the City of Thousand Oaks for five years and currently serves as a Commissioner for Ventura County Area Housing Authority.

Chief Lunn is an adjunct assistant professor in the Business and Law department at Los Angeles Mission College. In 2012, he earned the professional designation as a **Certified Elections/Registration Administrator** under the auspices of the Election Center and Auburn University and in 2014, he became a **Registered Election Official**.

Mark currently serves as the elected Treasurer for the County Records' Association of California and is on the Board of Directors for the California Association of Clerks and Election Officials.
